- 1. Call to Order:** Chair Faltings called the meeting to order at 3:00 p.m.
- 2. Public Comment:** Chair Faltings opened public comment. No public comments were received, and public comment period was closed.
- 3. Approval of the Minutes: Program Committee Meeting held on March 11, 2026.**
 - **Action:** The March 11, 2026 Program Committee meeting minutes were approved as submitted.
- 4. Soccer Program Update:** The Committee received an update from CSM Kirk on the new recreational soccer program which will start in the fall of 2026.
 - **Action:** Staff will report back on an update of the new soccer program at a future committee meeting.
- 5. Update on Ravenswood Historic Site Programming:** The Committee received an update from RS Benjamin on current and past programming, including adult and seniors events, corporate and partnership events, and rentals. Director Furst suggested reviewing additional parking needs when they become relevant.
 - **Action:** No Committee action was taken. This was an informational update and discussion only.

- 6. Discussion of Preliminary Special Events for the Coming Year:** Director Furst requested a review of upcoming special events to decide whether district-wide events require Board approval. CSM Kirk presented a list of 2025 special events for reference (Supplemental Item 6). After discussing and confirming there are no current district-wide events with the exception of the Fourth of July 5k Dash, Director Furst withdrew the request. The Committee asked staff to provide seasonal reports summarizing department-driven and co-sponsored events.

➤ **Action:** The Committee directed staff to provide seasonal special event summary reports to future committee meetings.

- a) CSM Kirk stated the Committee will receive an update on Open Space at a future committee meeting.
- b) GM Fuzie shared the types of events and programming held at the rodeo grounds, including the school district's Got Ag Day and mounted police training and competitions.
- c) GM Fuzie noted the Board will be considering moving the June 17, 2026 public meeting in the park from El Padro Park to the Sunken Gardens Pump Track.
